# "Inspiration in Watercolor from the Janet Tifft Heritage Fund" Class by Kathy McLean <br> Website: WatercolorsByKathyMcLean.com. 

## Supplies needed:

140 lb . watercolor paper - suggested: Arches Watercolor block, size $8 \times 10$ or $9 \times 12$. Or you can use 140 lb . watercolor paper, fastened down with tape or stapled. Do not use cheaper or lighter weight paper or a sheet that is not fastened down.

Watercolor Paints - Artist grade paints. I use Windsor Newton (WN), Daniel Smith (DS), Graham and Holbein. I will be using primarily Phthalo Blue, Quinacridone Rose (Graham), and Transparent Yellow (Winsor Newton). Other color options: Ultramarine Blue or Cerulean Blue, Alizarin Crimson (or other transparent pink/red), Quinacridone Gold (DS) Sometimes I like Hookers Green, and an orange to simplify mixing.

Brushes - A flat wash brush (if desired for wetting), a round brush (approx. size 10 ), and a smaller round (approx. 4) for detail.

Painter's tape - 1.5 inch and regular
Additional Supplies - Artist Masking Fluid, Carbon paper, a 2B pencil for tracing, Kneaded eraser, and a stylus.
