## **Workshop Update** February 9, 10 & 11

**March 9, 10 & 11** 

By now you have had the opportunity to "meet" three of our Premier Workshop Artists, Don Andrews, Andy Evansen and Mark Mehaffey. Remarkable to many of us is the fact that SAWG has been able to carry out our mission to provide these learning experiences to our members during such a strange period of time. We've had marvelous turnouts for our General Meetings when a demonstration was the focus, and we thank you wholeheartedly for your participation.

The evaluations we have received from the participants of Andy Evansen's recent workshop are glowing..." Excellent instructor and format. Especially appreciated Andy's style of repeating a number of key points - always reinforcing them. The pacing was also good and his method of empathy and positive reinforcement was effective." We are extremely pleased that he was well-received and appreciated.

During the January demonstration provided by Mark Mehaffey, the audience got a glimpse of the workshop he will be providing on February 9th, 10th and 11th, from 9 to noon daily. Beginning with a more traditional approach, in this workshop you will be taking a photo through the paces of sketching, value studies and color selection. From there, you will stretch your imagination by working on unique surfaces, including yupo. When Mark was with us a few years ago, he was rated as an outstanding presenter. Coming up at the General Meeting on February 8th will be a demonstration by Graham Berry, our final Premier Artist. Graham lives in the United Kingdom, which means our times are 7 hours apart. It may be necessary to tape this program for you, but regardless, if you've seen Graham's work, you won't want to miss it.

Graham's workshop will be delivered over 3 days, for 3 hours each day, from 8 am to 11 am AZ time, on March 9th, 10th and 11th. He will be live and looks forward to interacting with you, his students. If you check our website, you will find web addresses where you can examine his work. The predominant topic that he will be presenting is painting people.

It has been a unique year for SAWG, and the virtual nature of our workshops left us all questioning whether the membership would respond. We are so pleased that you have welcomed the challenge, and we thank you for participating.

Andy Evansen Workshop Review

"I am exhausted but exhilarated," I said to my husband after two intense days studying with Andy via Zoom. Twenty-five of us attended the two-day January workshop from 9am to 4pm. I will never forget the words, "big shapes first." Andy taught us to see the big stuff and not get bogged down in the detail. Even as experienced as he is, he ALWAYS does a value study, to find the big, connected mid-value shape. We learned about keeping the bead going and reloading

your brush to paint that big shape and to create colorful, smooth washes. "Practice a wash every time you sit down to paint to get warmed up." These were just a few of the things we learned. We ended the second day with Andy teaching us how to paint a rose with just a few brush strokes.

If you want to learn more from Andy, he told us that he does have some free videos on YouTube. Search for Andy's name, and you, too, can have a taste of what we learned.




# SOUM ROLL PLEASE!




