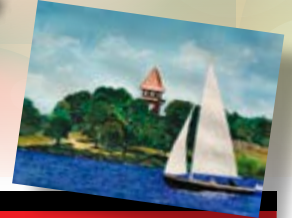

HAPPY NEW YEAR!

I am hoping that it will be happier and safer than 2021 but, I admit, it is worrisome with the new variant. We will be vigilant at the gallery but with so many of us vaccinated, it should be safe to carry on without another closure.

We need to figure out what you as members want from SAWG. Are we headed in the right direction? I will be forming a survey committee to prepare a short questionnaire so we can plan the future. We need to understand why are there so few entries for shows. Why is there so little traffic in the gallery? If we advertise, where should we spend those dollars?

On a good note, we applied for a grant with the Arizona Arts Foundation and will learn the week of January 25th if we will receive any funds. I want to personally thank Cindy Engquist, our new Fundraising/Grants Chair, for preparing the tedious application. It was very specific of what we could request with only three categories: artist fees, administrative and facilities. Therefore, we asked for funds to pay for our general meeting demonstrations (paying artists), funds for scholarships and supplies for our Intro to Watercolor classes (administrative) and funds for paying half of our rent (facilities.) Next month I will report the results. If we free up rent money, those funds can be used where they are needed most, perhaps publicity.

A thank you goes to Karyn Vampotic, who is heading up the nominating committee for SAWG this year. When you receive a call, please be ready to volunteer. See her article later in this newsletter for details of our needs. She is also hosting our new member event this year. Remember we had to do it via Zoom last year.

Please look at the article about past and recently deceased member Carolyn Kenney-Carter. (pg. 3) Carolyn's daughter donated 17 beautifully framed paintings to SAWG, including many matted originals. In January, we will use the Helen and Robert Jennette gallery to display these paintings for sale. The proceeds will benefit all aspects of the guild.

One last reminder: Western Fed deadline is soon! January 10th. Let's enter, get accepted and represent SAWG!

A Tribute to Carolyn Kenney-Carter

Long-time Member, Gretchen Huff, a dear friend of past member, Carolyn Kenney-Carter, alerted us of Carolyn's passing this year due to surgery complications. Carolyn's daughter asked Gretchen if she thought SAWG would be interested in her mom's framed paintings. Gretchen approached us, and we decided that this would be a great way to show off the Jennette Gallery and benefit from the proceeds of selling Carolyn's work.

There are seventeen framed pieces and many bin pieces that will be available for sale beginning January 3rd when we hang the Lasting Impressions show. Those who are bringing paintings that day will get the first glance as these fine pieces of work. All are professionally matted and framed.

We have reduced the original prices so that the pieces are more affordable and not out of line with what we have in the rest of the gallery.

Here's a little bit about Carolyn (an excerpt from Gretchen Huff's email to SAWG)

Carolyn Kenney-Carter 1945-2021

Living in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin, Carolyn was a winter visitor to Tucson where she enjoyed her involvement with SAWG, taking local workshops and classes in watercolor and enjoying our Tucson winter weather. She and her husband Richard kept a home here specifically for these winter visits. Carolyn was an avid cat lover, naming her art enterprises after her first beloved cat, "Ace the Wonder Cat". Thus "Wondercat Graphics" was created. Carolyn presented a veterinarian school scholarship each year to a candidate she selected. She and Richard were a publishing duo as she often did lovely illustrations for his books of poetry. Many of her friends did not know that she was also a talented musician with emphasis on the violin. Carolyn died far too young, and she and her beautiful watercolors will be greatly missed.

Carolyn was a graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Madison and former artist for Milwaukee's natural history and art museums. She was a member of the Transparent Watercolor Society of America, the League of Milwaukee Artists, the Drawing Studio and a signature member of SAWG.

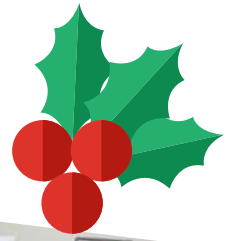

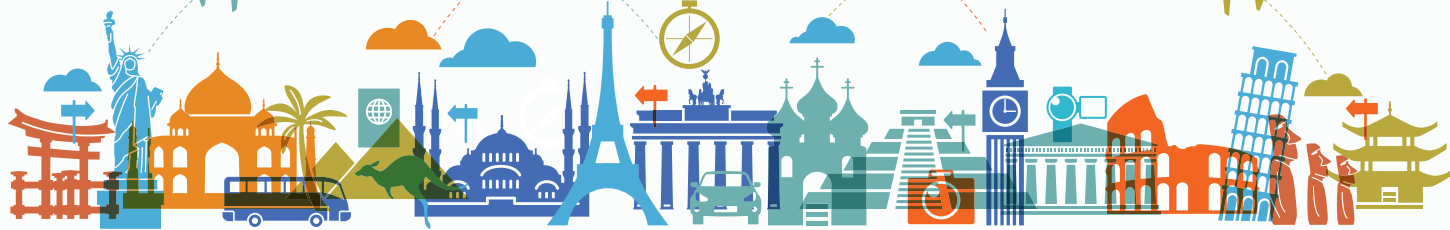

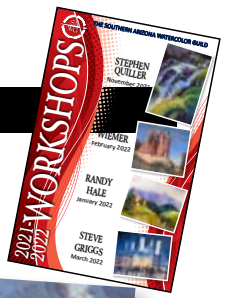

The deadline for entries and jpegs for the 54th Annual Show is January 21st.

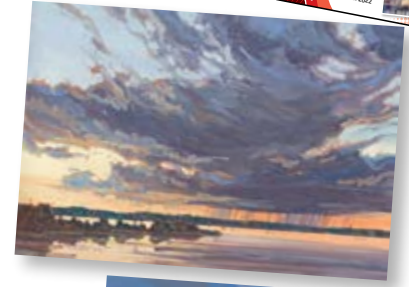
