IT'S TRANSPARENT!

Many recent shows at our gallery have identification labels listing the medium as "translucent watercolor". That term, though it may apply to the appearance of watercolor on paper, is incorrect for describing the medium of watercolor. The correct term is "transparent watercolor."

Here's a good excerpt from the University of Maine on the topic:

Watercolor, generally referring to transparent watercolor, is a technique of painting in which pigments ground with a binder and diluted with water are applied in washes to white or light-tinted papers. "True" or "classic" watercolors are characterized by a luminous transparency: no matter how many layers of color are applied, the paint remains translucent and allows the light to penetrate and be reflected from the paper support. Watercolor paints were being made by the late 1700s, at first as hard, dry cakes. "Moist colors" introduced in the 1830s were easier to work with. Working with this essentially liquid medium, painters can achieve a wide range of artistic effects by varying the composition of the paint, the manner of application, and the texture of the paper.

Since part of our purpose as a guild is to educate, it's important that the identification labels on works be accurate. Link to University of Maine reference:

Yupo for Everyone! Taught by Sue Ritz

Are you asking, "What is Yupo?" Or perhaps you've tried working on Yupo only to become frustrated with the results. Sue Ritz invites you to join her in one of her three-hour mini workshops in which she will focus on how to use Yupo (a tree-free paper). She will instruct students in the use of this relatively new surface for watercolor, from drawing on the surface to getting the paint to do what you want it to do. MORE SHOW NEWS — DOCENTING

Entering a SAWG show?

If you are new to SAWG and plan on entering a show, if selected to exhibit, you will be responsible to docent twice (2) during the show. In this case, the docent coordinator will contact you via email to schedule the dates you will docent. But first, you need to be oriented to the Gallery. (If you are a renewing member who hasn't been a docent recently, this also applies to you.) It is important that you have attended a docent orientation session so that you are comfortable with the docent responsibilities which include, in part, customer service, sales procedures, recording and reporting sales and gallery procedures, such as opening and closing the gallery. This will help the gallery to run smoothly.

The Gallery is a major asset to SAWG and to you as a member. It gives us a regular place to hold our shows and a place for your work to be seen by the public. Most art groups do not have this benefit and it is wonderful, but it requires a minimal amount of work from each member, such as serving as a docent and occasionally volunteering to help with a show or an opening, etc.

Docent orientation sessions are held the second Wednesday of each month, and additionally on an as-needed basis.
