This runs concurrently with the wonderful artwork of Frank Rose, our former SAWG president and author of a book on the Catalina Mountains, that includes many of his watercolors and is on sale at the gallery. Our last summer show is our Second Annual "Share our Walls" show! This is open to the community for any media that will hang on our walls. This is a juried show and was a huge success last year – tell all of your friends who love to paint, draw, create photographic art – we want it all! This is a great opportunity to reach out to the public to increase public awareness of our Guild and Gallery and increase attendance and sales.

Dennis Garrison joined me in Casa Grande for a meeting with the Arizona Watercolor Association (AWA) to discuss collaboration with the other two major watercolor organizations in the state. Boards for AWA and SAWG have approved your entry into each other's workshops at member prices beginning this year, beginning a month before the workshop date to fill any vacancies. 






Brenda Swenson - "Negative Painting with
