We have only three months left in fiscal 2022- March, April and May. Here's what's on the schedule for each of those months. Our membership drive will kick off on March 1 so remember to pay your dues when you get the message. In April we will vote on our next slate of officers and have a demo by Rick DeMont, and in May, we will have our Scholarship Awards presentation. Also, I will deliver our State of Guild message. All these General meetings will be at the church.

We are disappointed to learn that we missed receiving grant money from the Arts Foundation by a very small margin. The judges awarded us a 5.83 score, and we needed a 6.0 to receive funds. However, we formed a great relationship with the administrators, and they have provided feedback to us (because we were so close) in order for us to be successful on this next opportunity. We will be applying for the "Creative Capacity" grant with a more robust application with lots of examples of what SAWG does. We learned a lot about what it takes. The deadline for the application is March 24; Cindy Engquist and Kath Macauley will take us to the next step. Thank you both.

Thank you to the 75 members who responded to the survey and offered some great suggestions. The survey committee will assess what things we can execute and make a presentation to the Board. There was a landslide vote to keep the gallery but a few wished for it in a different location. You will receive a full report next month.

We have one more workshop this season: Steve Griggs will teach us how to do cityscapes with large brush strokes in the first session, March 15-16, and landscapes in the second, March 17-18. Sign up today for what promises to be a fascinating workshop, and according to Steve, "with lots of laughter and camaraderie as participants encourage one another's efforts and discover the beauty that emerges as they develop their own painting voice."

The "Try Watercolor with SAWG" classes are almost filled with just a few openings left. Lots of non-members have signed up so thank you for telling your friends about these classes. Plus, we added waitlists, so please encourage any friends who had postponed signing up to get on the waitlist as we will probably have some cancelations.

Let me leave you with this thought and inspiration. Did you know that Prince Charles is a watercolorist? The heir to the British throne stated that painting is "one of the most relaxing and therapeutic exercises I know," adding that his hobby "refreshes parts of the soul which other activities can't reach." Google it; it's very interesting that we share a hobby.

Paintings/ Prints. Also submit up to 15 images of originals or prints for a minimum of 3 mos. - \$15, 6 mos.-\$25, !2 mos. - \$45 plus tax. Just go to the "Members only" section of the site and go to Web Rentals for all the information. It is an incredible chance to show off & sell your work to everyone who accessed the site." ## Docent's Corner

### **Docent tip of the month:**

The only time you use Quick Sale is for cards (except those of Frank Rose. Frank's are special because they are a donation and are listed in inventory.) Everything else for sale in the gallery (paintings, bin work, tote bags, magazines and books) is listed in inventory.

Why is this important? If you use Quick Sale for any item, you risk making an error such as typing in the wrong artist's name, and that causes a ripple effect. We had an example from last November where a docent sold a piece of bin work, and the wrong artist was credited. That put the artist over \$600 in sales for taxes and they received a 1099 incorrectly, and the other artist didn't get paid. It took some sleuth work by the treasurer and the tenacity of the artist who didn't get paid to figure all this out so, please only use Quick Sale for cards.


