I have been to the gallery several times – once to deliver a computer for Sue to set up for our Point-of-Sale system and get the repairs done in the gallery, once to receive training of how to do a sales transaction (it's easy after you have done it and know where to find things), and to meet our new janitor, Albert Grijalva, and several times for the Sidewalk Sale.

Collection day was fun, as two newer members (P.J. Cathey and Robin Miller-Bookhout) who volunteered to be on the Sidewalk Sale Committee hadn't even been to the gallery before. So, they were indoctrinated by fire. I gave them the tour before the cars starting lining up with stuff to donate. Oh my, the middle room already had paintings and frames lining the walls. The long tables were set up so the pricing could begin. Twenty-seven folks donated so many items, there was no way we were going to get all outside on sale day, so it was going to be an outdoor/indoor event.

Sandy allowed me to submit my President's message late so I could share the Sidewalk Sale results with you. Sidewalk Sale day was even more crazy and fun than Collection Day. Sue Rumsey, our cashier, could hardly keep up with all the transactions. We made over \$2800 with 71 transactions. Some folks paid, put stuff in their cars and came back for more. By 10:15 most of the paper and watercolor paints were gone.

The best part was getting to see so many friendly faces, but sometimes I had to ask who was behind that mask. We will get to do that again soon. Planning is underway for opening the gallery for our summer shows. See Tad Lamb's article about what he and Kathy McLean have planned for you. We will train docents in June in small groups with a large screen so everyone can see and learn. We have decided to have a docent team so that there will always be a seasoned/trained docent with a newly-trained person. However, we will need you to volunteer to do this. Would one of you please volunteer to be the docent coordinator? Kathy McLean has stepped up to be Assistant VP Shows, so we need to back fill her role. We also need a someone to do the bins and cards. If no one steps up, we may have to eliminate them. Sue Emer can't do it all.

I look forward to seeing you at the General Meeting on May 10th at 4 pm. This is when we get to see the scholarship awardees and announce the slate for next year's Board of Directors. Most importantly, don't forget to pay for your membership renewal. Dues are due by May 31st.

Hello water media artists! For those of you who do not know me, my name is Tad Lamb and I've been enlisted to serve as VP of Shows for the 2021-2022 season. Some of you may know me through my activity in the Guild working on our AV Tech Team and more recently as your Image Archivist. As strained as these times have been, it has been a pleasure getting to know the membership through their paintings and through our limited communications.

I am also excited that my fellow Tech Team member, Kathy McLean has agreed to serve with me as Asst. VP of Shows. We have been working together during the past year with SAWG's series of virtual workshops and our virtual premier workshops and have proven ourselves compatible partners in extolling the joys of water media. We both look forward to the reopening of the Gallery and the coming year.

The first show, **Put a Bird in It**, will open in our Gallery on July 1st. Although it sounds like a bird show, the theme has been expanded to include anything with bird or a type of bird in it name, so bird dogs, old eagle eyes and the Birdman of Alcatraz are all fair game. Check in will be at 9:00 am Monday morning on June 28th. The procedure will be as normal with a few changes, namely the check-in tables will be outside with a minimum of members allowed inside the gallery. Hopefully, anyone who still has art in the gallery from last year will have picked up by that time.

Due to their popularity, both summer show receptions will be held virtually. The reception and awards presentation for 'Put a Bird in It' will be held July 8th from 4-6.

I am pleased to announce that Carolyn Robles has agreed to judge our first show and that we already have two very capable show chairs in Judy Constantine and Susan Hildreth. I am especially grateful to Judy for volunteering as her experience will be instrumental in guiding me through the first few months of this new job. That said, Kathy and I are still on the hunt for show chairs, so if this is something you have experience with or if it is something you would like to learn, please ask one of us. We anticipate having a lot of fun with this endeavor and it would be great to have you on the team.

The entry deadline for 'Put a Bird in It' is June 18th so it's not too early to start hatching some creative fledglings. Our Spring Workshop Classes are a Great Success!

Sweetwater Reserve — May 14th



We will gather Friday, May 14th at 8:00am at the Sweetwater Preserve, 4001 N Tortolita Rd, Tucson, AZ 85745. The trail has views of the Tucson Mountains and is popular with equestrians and mountain cyclists. There are bathrooms but no running water at the trailhead.
